
HEALING WAYS The Order of St Luke Spring 2011

Paul's whole ministry was marked by persecution and pain, but in each case it was for the glory of God, and for the benefit of unbelievers. Paul understood what we often forget; the way of the Cross is a necessary part of discipleship.

As we move through the season of Lent towards Easter, we are reminded of Jesus' words recorded in Luke 14:27 'Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple'. For God's work to be done and for his fruit to grow there is always a cost. It has been rightly said that the way of the Cross is essential for anyone to see the God of the Cross. In my work and in my living I am often reminded of the words of Charles Hadden Spurgeon, 'Preach at all times. Use words if necessary.' We need to turn to him in all our trials for our comfort and for the world to see and meet him.
