3. Reports

All the reports are contained in the booklet circulated immediately prior to the meeting.

a) Electoral Roll

The Electoral Roll report was included on page 10 of the report booklet.

Rev John Hellewell, reported that the roll has been completely renewed, as required by the Church Representation Rules, and there are now 23 people on the Electoral Roll, of which 7 are new.

No comments were made, nor questions raised.

b) PCC Review of the Year

A summary of the business conducted by the PCC in 2018 was included on pages 11 and 12 of the booklet.

No comments were made, nor questions raised.

c) Churchwardens' Fabric Report

The Churchwardens' Fabric Report was included on pages 12 to 14 of the booklet. Sue Degnan briefly summarised the report.

No comments were made, nor questions raised.

d) Deanery Synod Proceedings

A report of the proceedings of the Deanery Synod in 2018 was included on pages 14 and 15 of the booklet.

Rev John Hellewell briefly outlined the various levels of Synod, i.e. Deanery, Diocesan and General.

No comments were made, nor questions raised.

e) Churches Together

The Central Churches Together grouping did not meet during 2018 (as noted on page 15 of the report booklet).

No comments were made, nor questions raised.

f) Accounts and Financial Statements

The accounts and financial statements, including the reports from the External Examiner and the Treasurer, were included on pages 15 to 20 of the report booklet.

The Treasurer talked through the summary of accounts, pointing out that the General Fund had spent more than it had received, with the shortfall being funded from reserves; obviously, this is not sustainable in the long term and must continue to be a subject for prayer!

Rev John Hellewell expressed thanks to the retiring Treasurer, Bob Berridge for all his sterling work over many years. Mark Pemberton (Christ Church) is to take on the role of Treasurer for St. Augustine's on a trial basis; an assistant or assistants will be required to count collections, etc.

4. Appointment of Independent Examiner

5. Elections

a) Deanery Synod Representatives

An election was held last year with Shelagh Hirst being elected for a 3-year term; consequently, there is no election this year.

b) Lay Members of PCC

The Church Representation Rules specify the election of 6 lay members for our size of electoral roll. This year there are 3 vacancies, 2 as a result of completion of term of office and 1 as a result of moving home and church.

7. Vicar's Remarks

The Vicar's remarks were included on pages 22 and 23 of the booklet.

8. Any Other Business

Revd John Hellewell invited people to ask questions once they had had opportunity to digest the report booklet.

Jenny Lynn expressed her satisfaction with the solution for joint services, i.e. meeting jointly on the first Sunday of each month and, really importantly, maintaining a worshipping Christian presence at St. Augustine's. Revd John Hellewell agreed and predicted an exciting future! He further advised that up-coming clergy vacancies may well mean some changes being imposed – but we need to continue to listen to God.

With no further business being raised, the Chair closed the meeting.

1. Introduction

St. Augustine's Church has the responsibility of promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

St. Augustine's Church is part of a united benefice with Christ Church Mount Pellon, with separate PCCs being maintained for the two churches.

2. PCC Membership

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is a charity excepted from registration with the Charity Commission. Members of the PCC are either *ex officio* or elected by the annual parochial church meeting (APCM) in accordance with the Church Representation Rules.

At present the PCC operates one committee, the Standing Committee, which is the only committee required by law. It has the power to transact the business of the PCC between its meetings, subject to any directions given by the Council. The Standing Committee consists of the Treasurer, the Secretary, the Churchwardens, the Vice-chair and the Clergy.

3. Electoral Roll Report

As required by the Church Representation Rules, the Electoral Roll is wholly renewed every six years, the most recent occasion being in 2019.

There are 10 (2018 23) people on the Electoral Roll. The transient nature of the congregation means that every year a significant number leave the Roll but they are generally replaced by a similar number of new members. However, the pandemic during 2020 has severely reduced the opportunities to sign up new members and indeed to conduct baptisms resulting in the reduced number reported.

The usual Sunday attendance was 22 (2018 27).

4. PCC Review of the year

The PCC met on the following dates, with an average attendance of 71% (2018 65%).

- 08/01/2019
- 19/03/2019
- 22/04/2019
- 14/05/2019
- 16/07/2019 – *joint with Christ Church, no attendance record*
- 11/09/2019
- 12/11/2019

The PCC discussed a wide range of matters, both large and small, including the following:

- **Financial Management** – The PCC reviews the year-to-date accounts at each meeting with the Treasurer highlighting any particular points of note. In reviewing the 2018 yearend accounts, the Treasurer noted that 2018 was the first year that the General Fund had to be subsidised from reserves; it was suggested that efforts should be made to raise funds during 2019.
- **Services / Liturgy** – It was noted at the March meeting that the C of E had authorised Farsi liturgy for Order 1 of Communion. Whilst this was welcomed, the fact that we have adapted the order, meant it was of no immediate direct use to St. Augustine's.

Following a review of the numbers attending services at St. Augustine's over the summer, it was agreed to implement a revised, more compact layout for Sunday services. With no upturn in numbers, the revised layout was used for the rest of the year.

In quarter 4, the PCC agreed the introduction of a new, more intimate, style of service; initially this was used for non-Communion services.

- **Benefice Matters** – A working party was established to co-ordinate all non-service aspects of joint working across the benefice, with members drawn from both churches.

A new pattern for Communion services across the benefice was agreed at the March meeting.

The PCC discussed the plans for following the Jesus Shaped People program and agreed an Autumn start date to give time for publicity and encouraging as many people as possible to take part.

- **St. Augustine's Centre** – Every year the PCC allocates 10% of General Fund income to charitable causes. In light of the financial situation of St. Augustine's Centre, it was agreed that the charitable giving from 2018 income would be allocated to St. Augustine's Centre. At the end of 2019, the Centre asked the PCC to consider further financial support due to the very serious situation and after due consideration of the implications a donation was made.

A service to mark the 50th anniversary of St. Augustine's Centre was held at Halifax Minster on Sunday 20th January at 2019. Prior to service the PCC had the opportunity to review the order of service and promotion material.

During the year the PCC regularly discussed maintenance issues in St. Augustine's House, including replacing the flooring the ladies toilets and the re-decoration of Rooms 1 & 2.

- **St. Augustine's School** – At the January meeting the Vicar expressed the gratitude of the PCC to Ann Mansfield who had recently resigned as Governor of St. Augustine's School following 35 years' service, the last 15 as Chair.

5. Churchwardens' Fabric Report

a) *Services*

After much discussion and experimentation in 2018 regarding joint services within the United Benefice, since January 2019 the two churches have been meeting separately, except for a joint service, held at Christ Church, Pellon on the first Sunday of every month. This has proved to be a popular and workable balance which ensured a Christian presence within St. Augustine's parish.

From September 2019 a new layout to provide the opportunity for a different, more intimate, type of service was trialled. After a small change to the layout this type service has brought about the desired effect and allowed for more spontaneous

contributions from within the congregation to be involved in the service than previously experienced. Also as the number attending our services fluctuated from week to week there is no longer a rota in place for members of the congregation. The Church Wardens are very thankful to all those who volunteer on the day to set up and put away the furniture or the washing up afterwards.

b) *Grounds*

The Churchwardens are very grateful to all those who help to keep the gardens outside the Centre looking so attractive. We are especially grateful to the volunteer head gardener, Steve Blacksmith who along with his team of volunteers from St. Augustine's Centre do this important work. We also would like to thank all those volunteers who endeavour to keep the grounds tidy and litter free.

c) *St Augustine's House*

The St. Augustine's Centre charity continues to use and manage the building on a day to day basis. The Churchwardens value and appreciate the work of David Potter, the Centre's caretaker for continuing to oversee the general maintenance of the building and fittings.

Work on the house in 2019 included replacing the flooring in the Ladies toilets, as it had become a H&S hazard, as well as looking at options for providing hot water in there. Rooms 1 & 2 have been redecorated and refreshed by St. Augustine's Centre.

d) *Chapel*

The Chapel remains a place of calm and stillness within the busy Centre. It is a very useful spot to just 'be' in the presence of God; for prayer or for a quiet conversation.

Morning prayers are said in the Chapel on Monday mornings. Sung worship takes place on Tuesday lunchtimes followed by the International Bible study group. From September until Christmas 2019 this included the Jesus Shaped People Bible study which also involved members of both churches in the United Benefice. Occasional evening services continued to take place on key festivals of the Church year: Ash Wednesday; Ascension Day and St. Augustine's Day.

Various pieces of literature and information from the Church remain available on the side table along with a basket of children's bible story books nearby. Tealights remain accessible along with prayer request slips for those using the Chapel for private prayer.

e) *Inventory of Goods*

Following the Archdeacon's Visitation for the Halifax Deanery in May 2019 there is ongoing work to bring the Terrier (list of Church-owned property) up to date.

Also ongoing work was started to replace the altar with something more suitable which is portable and easier to store. It is the intention to replace the current lectern with one in keeping with the new altar. The 'mouseman' lectern was relocated to the Lady Chapel at Christ Church to be re-united with the 'mouseman' altar.

6. Deanery Synod Proceedings

As usual, deanery Synod met three times in 2019, at All Saints, the Mereside Café, and Lightcliffe C of E Primary Academy.

We discussed ecumenism, Bishop Jonathan's presentation, and working with primary schools.

At the end of the year the deanery was due to be formally amalgamated with Calder Valley Deanery, and indeed, this happened at the start of 2020.

Notes:

1. The financial statements of the PCC have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 using the R&P basis.
2. Moveable church furnishing and equipment held by the Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a facility for disposal, are recognised but not valued in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities.
3. A total of £429.14 of clergy expenses were paid to the Curate. No other payments were made to PCC members.
4. £3000.00 amounting to 30.73% of the PCC's General Fund receipts plus Contingency Fund Receipts was donated to St. Augustine's Centre.

Treasurer's Report for Year Ending 31 December 2019


The General Fund comprises St, Augustine's Church plus St. Augustine's House. The fund incurred a deficit of expenditure over receipts of £6,618.43 during the year.

£3,000.00 (amounting to 31.42% of the PCC's General Fund receipts) was donated to St. Augustine's Centre instead of the usual 10% of General Fund receipts donated to a small selection of Missions & Relief Agencies as in previous years.

This increase of 21.42% (31.42 – 10) amounts to £2,045.27 of the deficit. Without it, the deficit would have been £4,573.16 giving an increase of £1,178.54 on the 2018 deficit of £3,394.62.

The church has a small congregation comprising mainly of asylum seekers and non-wage earning immigrants with only 5 members of the congregation able to donate money to the church on a regular basis. The chances of increasing the amount of giving by the congregation are bleak, but the PCC is actively exploring ways of reducing the deficit by increasing income.

£213.21 of interest earned by the Church of England deposit account was paid into the Contingencies Fund (previously known as the Reserve Fund).



The accounts for the year ending 31/12/2019 were unanimously accepted by the PCC on 13/12/2020.

Textprayer Report

TEXTPRAYER has now been running for ten and a half years. Goodness knows how many individual texts I've sent out in that time. On a rough calculation its around a quarter of a million. What an achievement. Potentially 250,000 individual prayers prayed. Maybe more because of course the topics are put on people's prayer calendars and prayed more than once.

Never once have I doubted that God will answer, that he will intervene, perhaps not in the way we desire, but certainly he will bring good out of the situation even though it doesn't seem so at first, so that he can be praised and glorified.

A big thank you to everyone who has been faithful through the years. You're all prayer warriors. However, we still have work to do. I've no intention of packing in, until it's my turn to be prayed to glory...

School Report
